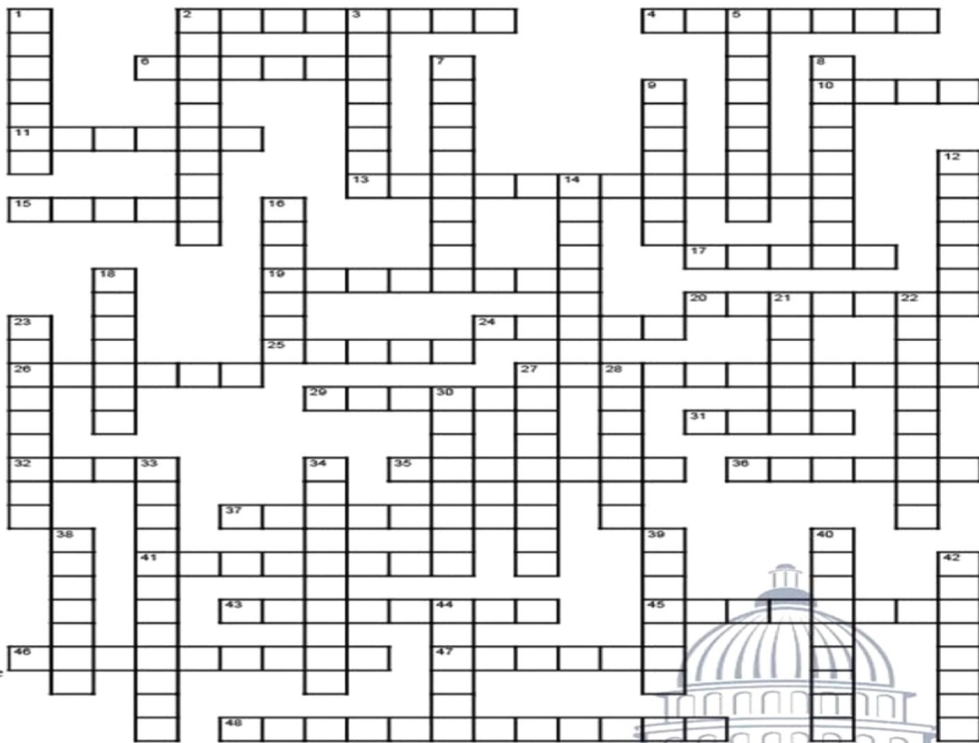

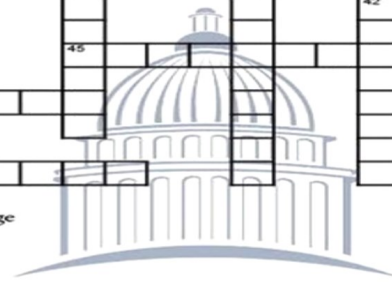

**CHOCOLATE
CHIP COOKIES**



RECIPE

1. 1/2 cup (113g) unsalted butter, melted.
2. 1/3 cup (66 g) granulated sugar.
3. 1/2 cup (104g) light brown sugar, packed.
4. 1 large egg.
5. 1 teaspoon (5ml) vanilla extract.
6. 1/2 teaspoon baking soda.
7. 1 1/2 cups (186g) all-purpose flour.
8. 1 1/2 cups (255g) chocolate chips (semi-sweet or milk)

Instructions:

Pace melted butter in a bowl. Add granulated sugar and brown sugar. Mix until smooth.
Add egg ,vanilla ,baking soda and salt
Put flour into mixture and mix until smooth.
Add chocolate chips

Line cookie sheet with parchment paper.
Spoon out two table. Spoon out two table-
spoons and place on sheet.

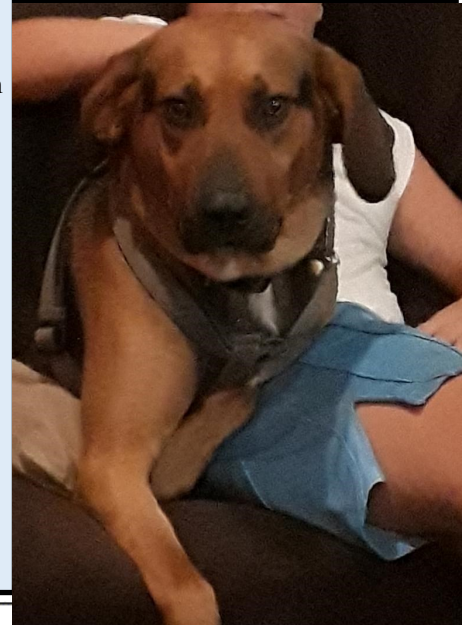
Refrigerate for two hours or put in freezer for
