Fraudulent Section 8 assistance advertisements like the one above are ap-

pearing on social media sites in increasing numbers. These sites direct members of the public to a fraudulent website, which harvests personal information and data.

What You Need to Know

A flyer has been circulating on social media advertising assistance with applying for Section 8 funding. The flyer and website

'www.govassistance.org'

are **NOT** legitimate. The scam aims to take advantage of Section 8 applicants to obtain their personal information to facilitate fraudulent activity. There are multiple versions of the above advertisement on various websites including Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok, typically with slightly changed verbiage and dates.

What You Can Do

Many individuals have personal social media accounts, which can be a great way to connect with others. However, malicious ads, scams, and misinformation are prevalent on these sites, and users should always be skeptical. In general, do not click on a hyperlink if you are unsure if it is legitimate; instead, go to a known, trusted source. For example, after seeing this ad, a user could navigate to hud.gov and research if this is a real program.

Individuals who fall victim to this or similar scams can file a complaint at the Internet Crime Compliant Center (IC3): <u>www.ic3.gov</u>.

Hello Everyone!

The PHA staff hopes everyone is enjoying all the sunshine we had lately! Here is a recap of some important things that you may need to keep in mind! These issues pertain to both Chatham Court and Quarry Heights.

A visitor of more than 7 days consecutive or within a 45 day period constitutes as a unauthorized occupancy and is a violation of the lease. **Residents you must obtain prior written consent from the Housing Authority for any guest visiting in excess of 3 nights and must report a guest vehicle with the PHA office**. Reminder you are also responsible for the conduct of your guests and shall be assessed any damages caused by your visitor.

Curb your dog: The term has two meanings, 1st is to keep your dog under control/out of trouble (keep leashed and confined so as not to cause trouble for others), and 2nd is to pick up your dog's poop. It is noticeable and several residents have been complaining that dogs are running rampant off leash or left alone to roam on the property, destroying plants, being tied to fire hydrants, just not being curbed. If it can be proven that a resident has not removed pet waste from the grounds, a removal charge of \$25/occurrence will be assessed against the dog owner.

Action Steps for Helping Someone in Emotional Pain

In 2018, suicide claimed the lives of more than 48,000 people in the United States, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Suicide affects people of all ages, genders, races, and ethnicities.

Suicide is complicated and tragic, but it can be preventable. Knowing the warning signs for suicide and how to get help can help save lives.

Here are 5 steps you can take to #BeThe1To help someone in emotional pain:

1. ASK:

"Are you thinking about killing yourself?" It's not an easy question but studies show that asking at-risk individuals if they are suicidal does not increase suicides or suicidal thoughts.

2. KEEP THEM SAFE:

Reducing a suicidal person's access to highly lethal items or places is an important part of suicide prevention. While this is not always easy, asking if the at-risk person has a plan and removing or disabling the lethal means can make a difference.

3. BE THERE:

Listen carefully and learn what the individual is thinking and feeling. Research suggests acknowledging and talking about suicide may in fact reduce rather than increase suicidal thoughts.

4. HELP THEM CONNECT:

Save the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline number (1-800-273-TALK) and the Crisis Text Line (741741) in your phone so they're there if you need them. You can also help make a connection with a trusted individual like a family member, friend, spiritual advisor, or mental health professional.



5. STAY CONNECTED:

Staying in touch after a crisis or after being discharged from care can make a difference. Studies have shown the number of suicide deaths goes down when someone follows up with the at-risk person.
