

MIDDLESEX YOUTH CAREER DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Middlesex Youth Career Development Services is designed to empower out of school youth ages 18-24 providing them on the job training, paid internships or access to certificate programs at Middlesex Community College. Youth must be low-income and live in Middlesex or New Haven County.

Students work with the program coordinator to set specific employment and/or education goals while in the program. Students are placed into employment after completion of the certificate program.

Certificate programs include: Phlebotomy, Certified Nursing Assistant, Emergency Medical Technician, Medical Billing and Coding, Patient Care Tech (PCT), Personal Trainer, Pharmacy Tech, Security Guard, Skill Up for Manufacturing, Sterile Processing, Real Estate, and Human Services Assistant.

The program is funded by the Workforce Alliance through the Workforce Investment Act (WIA). This program is a partnership between the Community Renewal Team (CRT) and Middlesex County Chamber of Commerce.

The primary mission of the program is to help unemployed and displaced workers find employment.

The program's goal has always been to put the people in the best possible position to secure employment and earn wages that will allow them to provide for their family and contribute to the fabric of the community. We like to describe our role as being a "bridge between job seekers and employers." As a business organization, the chamber has strong links to a wide range of employers in Middletown and the Greater-Middletown area. One of the chamber's main functions is to help our members as they seek to hire quality employees.

Before beginning the job search, chamber staff members help clients create effective resumes and prepare for job interviews while providing job coaching and employment retention training. chamber staff maintains consistent contact with both clients and employers to foster the best possible environment for not only placement into employment, but long-term security in the job.

The Middlesex Chamber Worker Preparation Team will recruit job seeking clients who fit in into the guidelines set by the Community Development Block Grant, the City of Middletown Common Council, and the Citizens Advisory Committee. Chamber staff will assess the client's readiness for employment, assist in the development of a presentable resume, and conduct follow-up interviews to gauge the client's progress. Client meetings will take place at the centrally-located Chamber of Commerce building, and the job search will occur throughout Middlesex County.

The Middletown Worker Preparation Program is a critical program that continues to be a bridge between job seekers and employers.


